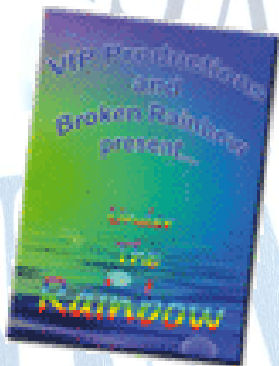

Latest VIP Resource

Under the Rainbow is a newly developed DVD for use with children and young people to explore homophobia, prejudice and issues and causes of violence.



The DVD was made in partnership with Broken Rainbow a national organisation which provides support to LGBT people affected by Domestic Violence. This DVD is now complete and was launched in Edinburgh in October.

Early evaluations indicate that children can learn a great deal about the issues and it may change attitudes and reduce hate crime. We are also currently in a partnership with Broken Rainbow to find out more about domestic violence in young people's relationships.

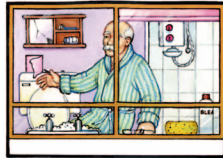
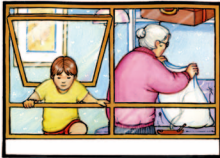

Latest VIP Resource

The Safe House V.I.P. Game is newly out this month. It was originally developed as a resource for use with the Senior V.I.P. programme (for the elderly) but it has been adapted for use with all age groups from age 7 to vulnerable adult. Each game consists of 4 house shapes and players win pieces including door, chimney, plants, cat, fence, etc to make up a complete house. They do this by answering and discussing violence and safety questions to win each piece. Then they get the 4 windows by spotting the dangers in each picture. It's a lot of fun and a great way to learn about different kinds of safety and violence prevention.

VIP Accreditation coming soon

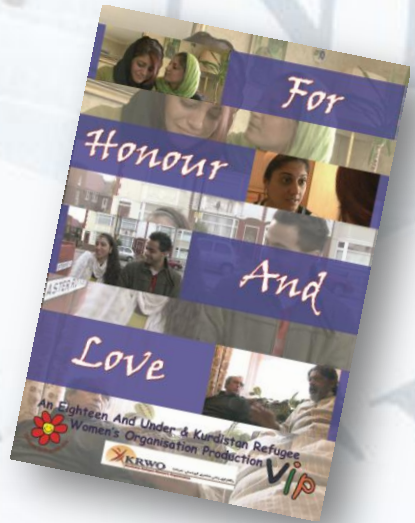
Accreditation of V.I.P. leaders and trainers is a step nearer. We have designed a training programme, developed standards and systems for approving providers and worked out methods of monitoring, evaluating and recording to ensure high standards of delivery and training are maintained. By the end of this year, we will be in a position of offering training and accreditation to workers who meet our standards of knowledge, methods and ability.

We have been working in a further 2 Primary Schools delivering Violence Is Preventable with every child in the school and reaching a total of 950 nursery and primary aged children. The disclosures of violence and abuse we have been hearing are phenomenal. It is truly awful what some children are living with daily.

New DVD now available

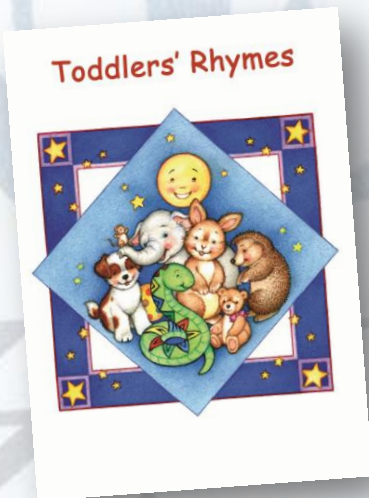
Our long awaited DVD For Honour and Love is finally available. This DVD will be officially launched in London and Edinburgh soon. It is the result of a partnership between 18u and the Kurdish and Middle-Eastern Refugee Organisation which is based in London. They translated several of our resources into Kurdish and Arabic and we made the new DVD with them focusing on honour killing, forced marriage, FGM and other cultural issues. The DVD was funded by the Nationwide Foundation.

Toddlers' Rhymes

Our volunteer artist has finished painting pictures for the new toddler rhymes book for the new parent and tot V.I.P. pack. This book is with the designer and will go to the printer in the next few days once it has been proof read.



The parent's book part of it is almost complete and along with Happy Dog & Pals will form the new pack which will be made available to parents with young children. Hopefully use of this pack will encourage positive interaction between carers and young children, encourage non-violent solutions to conflict and behaviour management and teach parents positive ways to encourage and support their children.

Additionally we offer training and consultancy services to agencies, produce resources to assist with the support of abuse survivors and conduct research into causes of ritual abuse.

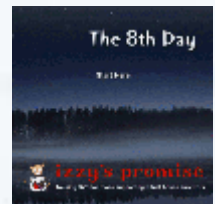

Change to legal status of 18u

Eighteen And Under made the changeover of legal status to a company limited by guarantee on 1st October.

There was a lot of work involved but change was essential to our future development. In reality the change of status does not make a huge difference to the day to day work we carry out. We are still a charity, but it means we now have Directors rather than Trustees.

We have also made some changes to our articles and memorandum which allow us to work outside Scotland. This is essential to developing the prevention work further in other countries across the world.

Busy busy busy!

Our Taywise and D.A.S.I. Projects which work with young people at risk of, or involved with, sexual exploitation and domestic violence are extremely busy. We are currently providing direct support to young people in Fife, Angus, Perthshire, Dundee, Ayrshire, Aberdeen, Edinburgh, Grangemouth, London and Glasgow.

Our [message board](#) is worth a visit. We have, this month, had 5 child protection cases involving children under 6 years old. Sadly, these families have turned to us due to a lack of trust in statutory child protection services.

Introducing a new service...



We spotted another gap in services and have started a new charity called **18Plus**. We have received charity status and this new organisation will focus on developing support services for **male survivors** of child sexual abuse and for **elderly survivors**. Already we have raised £12,000 towards developing this exciting new service. Watch this space.

Facts: we have undertaken much training of staff, volunteers and students in delivery of V.I.P., equality issues, support skills and a number of other important things. Time for training, reflection and discussion is not easy but is essential. We have 5 new students who have joined us and already they are working as hard as we are.

Our view...

A very interesting response (quoted in an article from the Dundee Courier on October 26th) above to the launch of our new Under the Rainbow DVD, and **totally contrary** to the findings of the recent online survey we conducted in conjunction with London based Charity, Broken Rainbow. In fact 100% of the young respondents to the survey from Dundee city said **they had** experienced homophobia in Dundee.

We also **know homophobia exists in schools** because of the thousands of young people we have spoken to through support services, or via delivering our VIP Programme and we are quite amazed that this hasn't ever come to the attention of the Education Convenor.

Worryingly, Liz Fordyce went on to say "I would also have to say that by raising awareness that this sort of thing can happen often you encourage it where it didn't exist before." **Applying such a statement to bullying, or domestic violence, or racism or rape or child abuse would be (we hope) unthinkable.**

Happily, the launch of the DVD at the City Chambers in Edinburgh went really well and it is surely a sign of **greater tolerance in Scotland** that we were able to make this DVD and hold this event peacefully.

We hope the DVD will be embraced by schools and communities where it will raise awareness of homophobia and hate crime and to **create a better understanding of diverse communities**. Hopefully it will also reduce the violence which many LGBT people and their families experience.
